Seeding Guide

SEEDING A NEW LAWN

- 1. Prepare seed bed by removing debris and large rocks then till the soil to a depth of approximately 4".
- 2. Apply and rototill and recommended soil amendments.
- 3. Smooth and firm soil by raking with large landscape rake.
- 4. Irrigate to settle and firm soil. Rake smooth when dry.
- 5. Apply a seed-starter fertilizer. (16-16-16)
- 6. Broadcast seed as evenly as possible for uniform coverage. Do not over-apply seed.
- 7. Using rake, incorporate seed and fertilizer into top ½" soil.
- 8. Roll surface with a medium weight roller to firm soil around seed.
- 9. Keep surface moist with frequent light watering. Do not allow seed to dry out. Seed bed may be watered at any time of day. Leave no standing water.
- 10. Mow when new lawn is 2" tall and soil is firm. Fertilize again at first mowing.

REPAIRING A LAWN

FOR SPOT REPAIR:

- 1. Expose and loosen soil, remove dead and thin grass with vigorous raking or with a lawn renovator.
- 2. Uniformly apply a seed-started fertilizer. (16-16-16)
- 3. Sow seed evenly to cover bare area.
- 4. Keep surface area moist until germination is complete.

FOR OVERSEEDING:

- 1. Mow existing turf to 1".
- 2. When lawn surface is dry, broadcast seed uniformly.
- 3. Keep surface area moist until germination is complete.
